Five 24/7 Neighbourhood Support Teams comprising a Sergeant and up to 18 Officers and PCSOs. 2. A Proactive Team with a Sergeant and 13 staff focusing on retail and theft from person crimes. 	<p>The sector structure and business plan is based on the National Intelligence Model and Neighbourhood Policing Model, which has been developed in line with Home Office guidelines.</p> <p>The strategic goals of the city centre are to reduce crime and disorder and make our communities feel safer.</p>
